AMERICAN REFLECTIONS

Music For the 250th Anniversary of the Boston Tea Party and Beyond

Sunday, October 22, 2023 at 4:00 PM Trinity Memorial Church, 44 Main St. Binghamton, NY

In recognition of the 250th anniversary of the Boston Tea Party (1773-2023), the first concert of our 45th Season celebrates America's earliest music with a cappella pieces by William Billings, music from Aaron Copland's *The Tender Land*, settings of Whitman poetry by Ned Rorem, and Randall Thompson's *The Testament of Freedom* based on words by Thomas Jefferson.

Longtime Madrigal Choir accompanist, Jean Herman Henssler, is joined at the piano by Lee Shepherd to play 4-hand accompaniments on the Copland pieces, and solely accompanies the Rorem art songs performed by guest soprano, Christina Taylor. Thompson's rarely-performed four-movement *Testament of Freedom*, also accompanied by Henssler on piano, concludes the concert.

Our last concert of the season celebrates both American words and music as we join with Southern Tier Actors Read (S.T.A.R.) at St. Thomas Aquinas Church to share some of America's favorite poetry. STAR began in 2010 under the leadership of actors Judy McMahon and Heidi Weeks when they started a "Readers Theater" that met monthly to read classic and modern plays. If it was agreed that a particular play should be produced for the public at various venues around the area, they staged them. Since then almost 80 plays have been read, from "Little Foxes" to "These Shining Lights." The emphasis is on the words and the story, rather than sets, lighting and costumes. STAR Directors Judy McMahon and Chris Nickerson are looking forward to collaborating with The Madrigal Choir for this special event!
